

Friday morning: We are presenting a special plenary session with three speakers. 4. Each author will be informed of acceptance or non-acceptance of his or her paper by May 16, 1983.
5. The author must be present at the CLA Annual Conference to present the accepted paper and lead the discussion.
6. Papers may be published later in the Canadian Library Journal.
